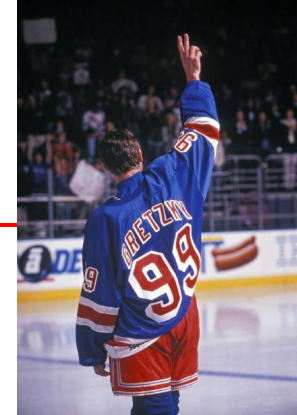
.....And just like that, our season has come to an end..!!!

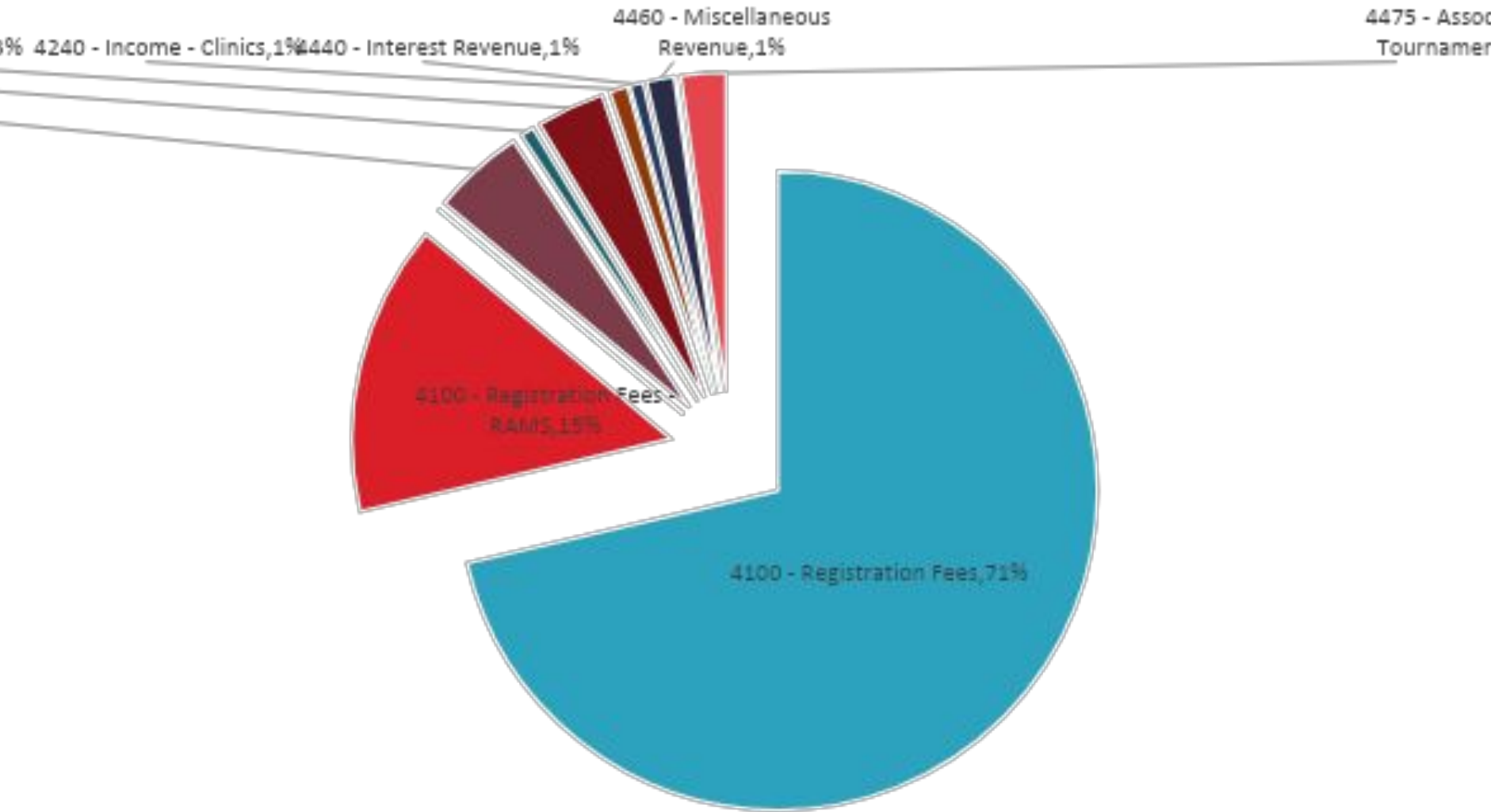

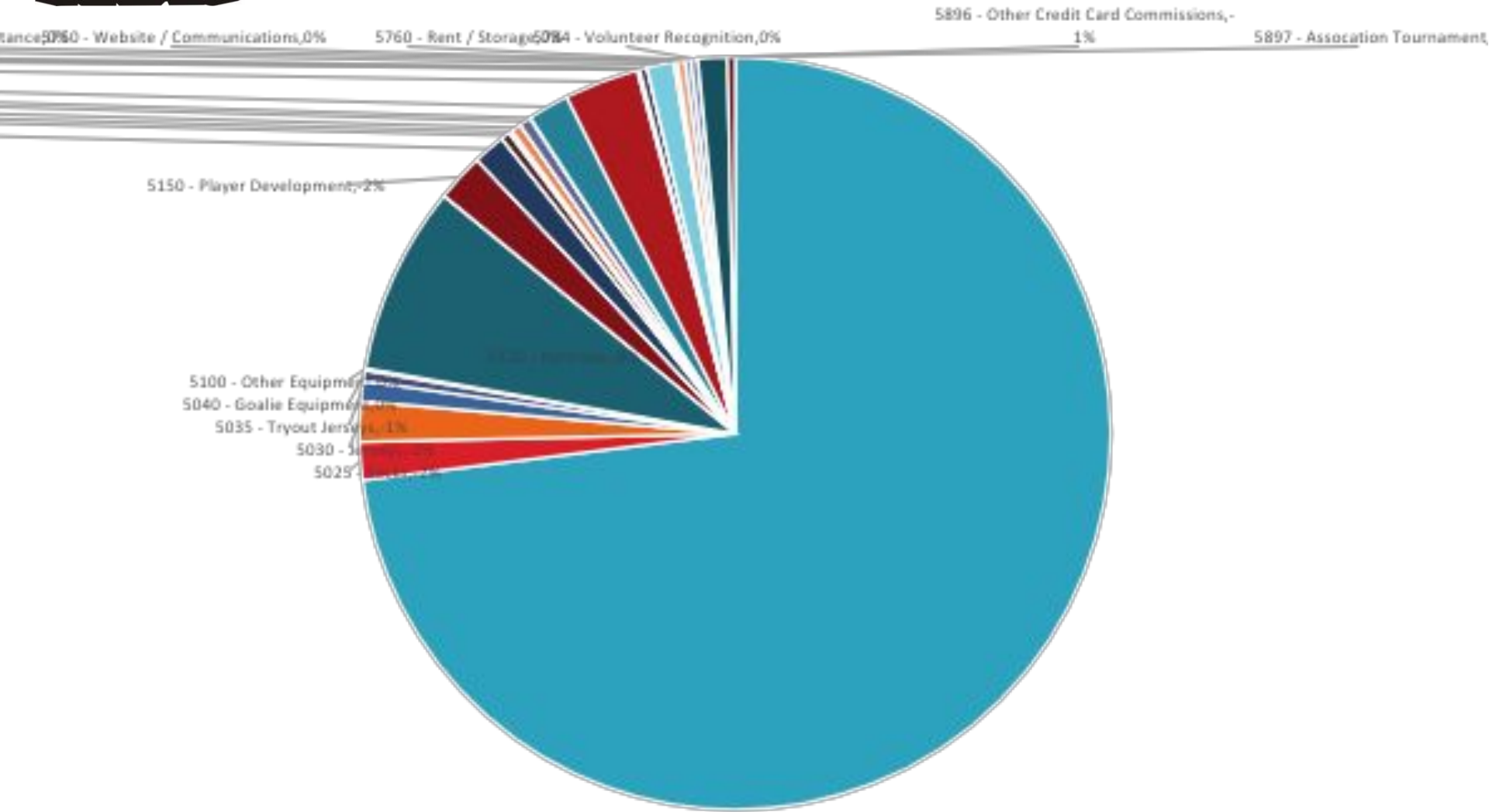


SMHA Financial Review - Revenues



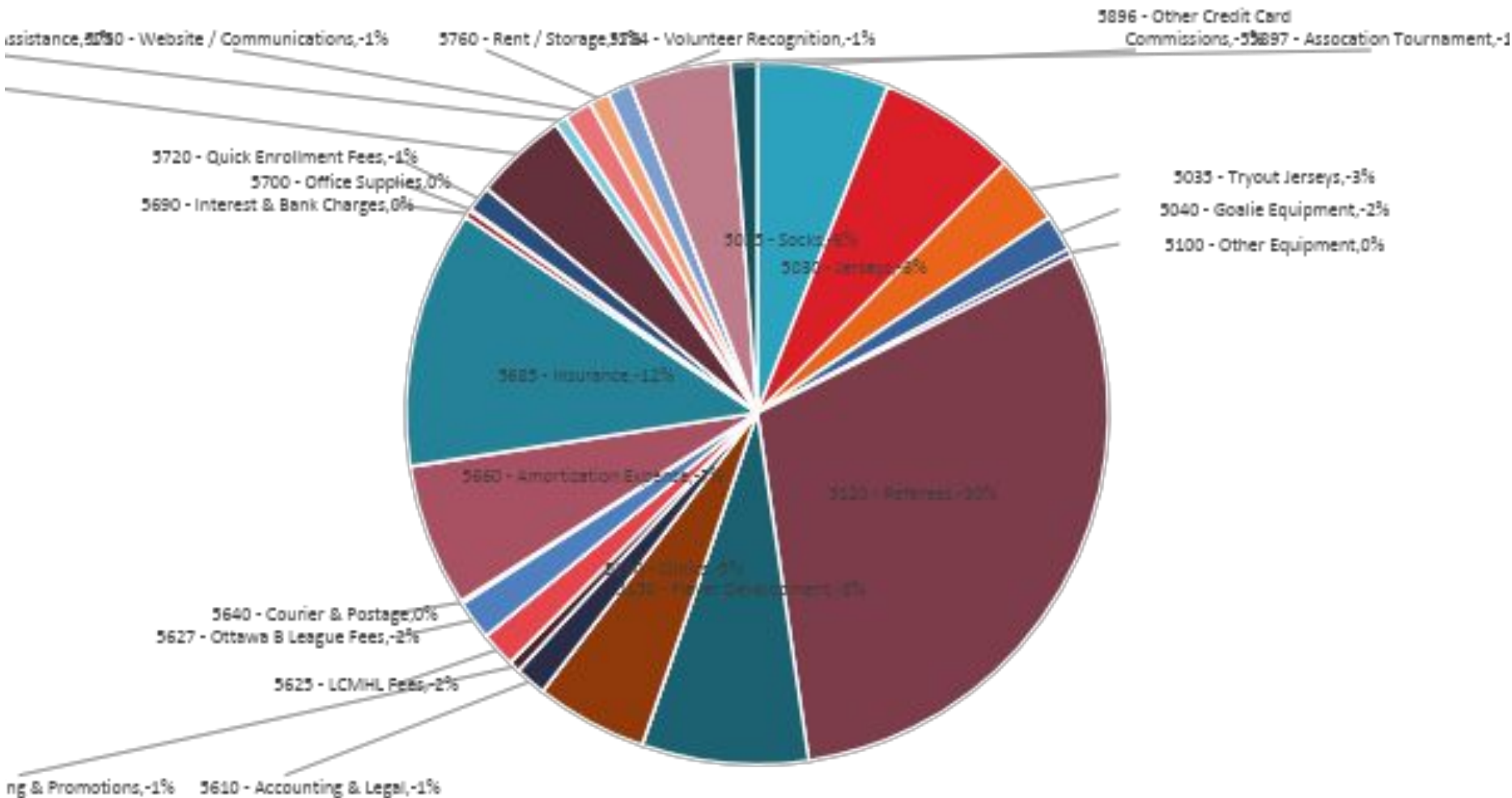


SMHA Financial Review - Expenses

SMHA Financial Review

- Highlights for entire hockey season
 - Overall budget for hockey season was a deficit of (\$53,540)
 - Registration lower than originally budgeted
 - Benefiting from higher interest rates, interest revenue
 - 3 successful tournaments held by the association generated approx. \$20K in tournament fees
 - Additional socks and corrections on jerseys costs were incurred but not originally planned
 - Hockey Eastern Ontario insurance costs incurred were lower than budgeted however, a late received invoice is currently under review
 - Registration fees paid via credit card were higher this year, which doubled the credit card processing charges

Operations Report 2022/2023 - Ice

2022/2023 Season Highlights

- SMHA saw the return of a mostly normal year in terms of ice allocations, with the exception of the delay in opening Cardel-A due to some unplanned maintenance requirements
- SMHA was able to work closely with the city throughout the season to identify opportunities to add extra ice as available

Working with Partner Organizations

- SMHA works closely with partner associations to ensure unneeded ice is offered for sale to other local organizations including Titans, S7, Goulbourn Rockets, and West Ottawa Ringette.



Operations Report 2022/2023 - Ice (continued)

Summer ice

- Ice has been booked with the city for Rams conditioning and ref training

2023/2024 Season

- The annual City ice request for 2023/2024 season was submitted in April and assumes a normal season.
- City ice rental rates will be increasing by ~\$5/hour
- The City will provide opportunities to return any unneeded ice prior to the start of the season.
- SMHA will continue to assist Ottawa Valley Titans book their City ice for the 2022/2023 season.

Beckwith Arena

- The contract with Beckwith remains in place through 2027 and allows SMHA to resell any unneeded ice to other minor hockey organizations.



Operations Report 2022/2023 - Equipment

- Equipment returns (jerseys, pucks and trainer kits) date has been scheduled for this weekend.
- SMHA has submitted its order request to continue participating in the McDonalds 'AtoMC' sponsorship program for House U11 which provides teams with AtoMC sweaters, socks and a toque.
- Orders for equipment requirements for 2023/2024 season are underway.



Operations Report 2022/2023 - Officials

- SMHA recruited 9 new referees and 18 new timekeepers that completed the 2022/2023 season.
- SMHA continues to focus on a mentorship and learning program to support new referees to ensure they feel supported and continue in their roles over the long-term.
- First year referee and timekeeper courses are being reimbursed by SMHA.

U11/U13 House Season

- Overall registration numbers were down but consistent with previous birth years.
- 6 teams in U11 (91 participants) and 9 teams in U13 (134 participants)
- All teams completed full season.
- Return of the traditional playoff format
- Continued to follow U11 Pathway within HEO



U11/U13 Successes

- At least 5 tournament wins for SMHA teams this season.
- Coach and Team staff ratings were very good with no major issues mentioned.
- The late start for U11 led to game rescheduling issues, but were resolved
- League champions at the U13 A and B levels (both teams in each championship series were SHMA teams)



U11/U13 Challenges

- Late start caused by competitive tryouts for U11 under the Pathway program continued to frustrate younger players and parents.
- Continue to struggle with balance at the C levels within LCMHL, Associations without A teams continued to dominate significantly.
- Struggles developing at the A level due to lack of teams, for both U13 and U11.
- Lack of full-time goaltenders entering U11 due to restructured U9 program. U13 had an excess of goalies with this surplus is projected to disappear next year.

U15/U18/U21 House Season

- Strong registration in U15 and U18 age groups with 8 teams at U15 (124 players) and 7 teams at U18 (115 players)
- "Back to Normal" with no interruptions, standard regular season and playoff structure, and tournament play
- Unable to field a U21 team with only 11 interested registrants, LCMHL did not run a league for this age group
- Team staff and volunteers were amazing this year, this was the highest survey satisfaction rating I've seen
- Special thank you to our conveners: **Joe Discher** at U15 and **Bethany Roy** at U18. Conveners do the heavy lifting all season



U15/U18 Successes

- Ice touches were up averaging 75 in U15 and 58 in U18
- Competitive in league play
 - Regular season champions: U15 A1
 - Finals champions: U15 B2, U18 A2
 - Finals runners-up: U15 A2, U15 B6, U18 B2
- Great successes in tournaments
 - U15 A2 won every tournament they entered (4 for 4)
 - U15 B2 won 2 including Jay Peak
 - At least 3 other tournament wins and too many 2nd place finishes to count
- Suspensions and disciplinary actions way down YOY, 10 at U15 and 32 at U18
- U18 Grad game was a huge success



U15/U18 Challenges

- Continued difficulty finding enough goalies particularly at the U18 level
- Competitive issues at U18 level with high registration numbers forcing us to field two A teams even with 3 competitive teams drawing from the same pool
- While player suspensions were down, we still saw a lot of questionable coach suspensions; complaints continue about the power imbalance in favour of officials
- Didn't get to fully execute on our plan to diversify the practice ice options at U18



U15/U18/U21 Looking ahead to 2023-24

- Expecting to struggle at U15 level for goalies with just two 2009s expected
- Player numbers will be down at U15, but up at U18 due to large 2008 class, we should expect to be forced to field two A teams at both levels again
- Will need to continue to work on a plan to improve the quality of programming provided during U18 practice ice
- Make U18 grad game an annual tradition
- Look for ways to increase U21 participation both inside SMHA and with associations willing to interlock

U7 [IP] Year In Review – 2022-2023

- 8 Teams with approximately 16 players per team @ 126 players = -17% from 21/22
 - 71 @ 2016's (21/22 had 75 'oldest birth year')
 - 37 @ 2017's (21/22 had 60 'next oldest birth year')
 - 18 @ 2018's (21/22 had 17 'youngest birth year')
 - 21/22 had 152 players (+30% from 20/21)
 - 20/21 had 117 players (same as 19/20)
 - 19/20 had 118 players
- Hosted a very successful U7/U9 Social raising **\$3,305** for the Stittsville foodbank. Kudos to Marie Côté & Mike Taylor for organizing!

- 2 teams @ A; 7 teams @ B; 3 teams @ C (added 1@B, 1@C to strengthen our lower tiers)
 - 72 @ 2014's
 - 81 @ 2015's
- 9 players not included above from SMHA played with S7
 - 21/22 had 122 players (+6% from 20/21)
 - 20/21 had 115 players (-31% from 19/20)
 - 19/20 had 167 players
- Hosted a successful SMHA funday on March 26 for the B teams with 11 of 12 teams attending. Kudos to Allyssia Chamberlain for organizing.

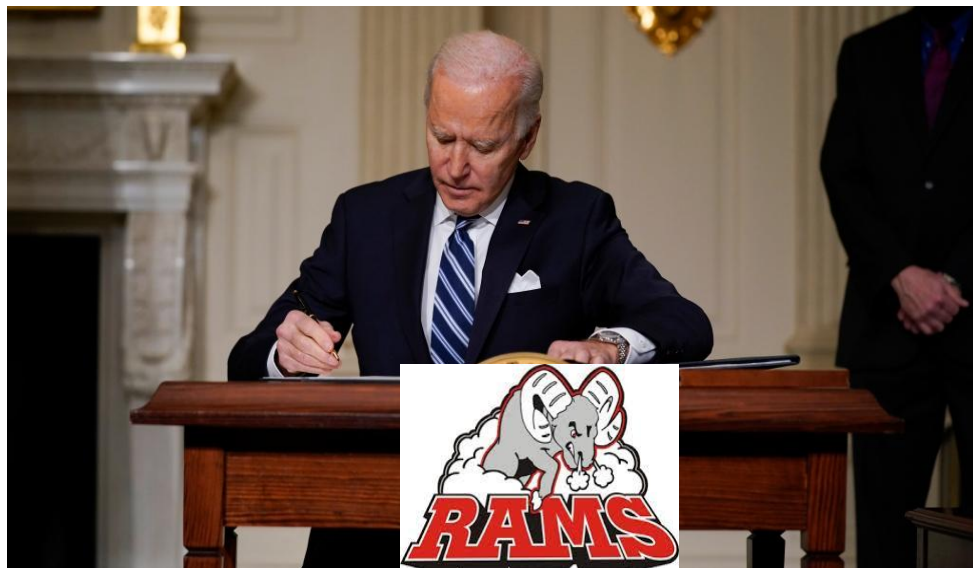

 - Nominating Chairperson is appointed to receive nominations.
 - If more than one nomination received in advance and by the deadline, a vote is required.
 - If only one nomination received by the deadline, the person is acclaimed to the position.
 - If no nominations are received in advance of the deadline, nominations can be done from the floor at the AGM – if there is more than one nomination from the floor, a vote will be required.
 - If there are no nominations from the floor, the Executive can appoint from Management Council after the AGM.
